

SHORT CURRICULUM VITAE of Maurizio Cotta

Maurizio Cotta, professor of political science, is currently director of the PhD program in Political Science and of the Centre for the Study of Political Change (CIRCaP) of the University of Siena. He has taught at the University of Texas at Austin (1989-90), the European University Institute of Fiesole (1992-1993), the IEPs of Lille and of Paris, the University of Montpellier, the Udmurt State University of Izhevsk and the Central European University of Budapest (Jan-Feb 2010). Was visiting research fellow at Yale University (1980-1981) and at the Minda de Güzburg Center for European Studies of Harvard University (Fall 2000). He received a *Honoris causa* doctorate from the Universidade Nova de Lisboa (9 April 2014) and the title of Honorary Professor of the Udmurt State University of Izhevsk (7/6/2011).

His main interests are in the field of the comparative study of political elites and political institutions and of Italian politics. He is co-editor and co-author of *Parliaments and Democratic Consolidation in Southern Europe* (Pinter 1990), *Party and Government* (1996), *The Nature of Party Government* (Palgrave 2000), *Parliamentary Representatives in Europe* (Oxford University Press 2000), *Democratic Representation. Diversity, Change and Convergence* (Oxford University Press 2007), *Perspectives of National Elites on European Citizenship. A South European View* (Routledge 2011) and co-author with L. Verzichelli of *Political Institutions of Italy* (Oxford University Press 2007) and author of *Democracia, Partidos e Elites Politicas* (Livros Horizonte 2008). He has coordinated the 6th Framework Programme Research project INTUNE on the development of a European citizenship and identity (2005-2009), and is now coordinator of the European Horizon 2020 research program EUENGAGE: *Bridging the gap between public opinion and European leadership: Engaging a dialogue on the future path of Europe* (2015-2018).
