

For what the ORCID ID is needed for and how to get it

ORCID is one of the widely used international systems of personal identification of authors' academic publications. It is a unique 16-digit code assigned to the author in order to unequivocally identify his/her works and research results. ORCID is used to identify authors in the international databases of scientific publications including Scopus, Web of Science, RINC (elibrary.ru), CrossRef. The ORCID account provides information about the scientist's name, place of work, and research. The account also supports automatic links among all author's profiles in different databases. By adding posts to the ORCID profile the researcher clearly links them to his name. This helps to avoid multiple profiles of an author and numerous errors due to the same or similar names, as well as different versions of their transliteration.
